Look inside

Looking inside has two dimensions—look inside yourself individually, look inside your church Assess your life and your church—successes, failures, everything—against the backdrop of Scripture Assess your life and your church—successes, failures, everything—in your own context Commit yourself to fixing weak and broken places with God's help Get ready for some "out of the box" thinking, brainstorm rather than cloning Think broadly, think across disciplines, learn from others, consider other organizations and other applications

Where are the entry points to your community?
Seek ways to meet needs innovatively
Share the good news in the context where people live
